The official currency in Lithuania is Litas. Litas is bound to € with 3.4528 Litas for € 1. Currency can be exchanged at the airport, banks and in hotels.

**Electrical appliances**

The voltage in Lithuania is 220 volts.

In an international survey, Vilnius is rated as the safest capital in the Baltic States and also safer than many European capitals. The hygienic standard in Lithuania in general is of a very high level. No special precautions are needed, no special vaccinations required.

### **Shopping**

Shops are generally open 10.00–19.00 on weekdays and 9.00–17.00 on Saturday. Many shops are open on Sunday as well. Most major shopping centers and supermarkets are open 8.00–24.00 daily.
